U need:

seed beads Toho 11/0

superduo beads $2,5 \times 5 \text{ mm}$


czech fire polished faceted crystal beads 4 mm

round beads 4mm

Click on the diagram to enlarge it:


Thread a needle onto each end of the thread (red color on the diagram is the needle nr 1 and blue color is the needle nr 2)




After you finish step 10 repeat steps 7 ~10 to desired length of the bracelet but note you have to finish with round beads as shown on step 10


Attach the clasp in the end
